
Dear fellow travellers on a Growing Orbit,

It has been a while since my last Newsletter, and here we are, approaching the last major celebrations of the year 2024, starting with the Solstice on 21st December.

May you rejoice in the return of the Light and be guided by it!



As some of you have noticed, over the past months, I've paused the online circles I used to facilitate. Last March, I took the rather radical decision to divorce from my computer (we are still friends, don't worry!) and shift my focus to more work outdoors. With the exception of online sessions with clients based abroad, I've been spending many hours with my feet on the Earth every week, not only for the therapeutic work I offer in Nature, but also to plant new trees, clear densely overgrown areas around my practice and repopulate the Medicine Wheel at the top of the hill with new bulbs and medicinal plants (hélas some have already been dug up or eaten



by wild hungry boars and deer!). Oh dear!

It has been 9 months of physically demanding labour, but the deep connection with the more-than-human world has been invaluable. As I write this, alongside dozens of smaller plants and shrubs, two beautiful *Juglans* Regia (common walnut tree), two *Malus Domestica* (apple tree), two *Prunus Avium* (cherry tree), two *Prunus Domestica* (plum tree), two *Rubus Idaeus* (red raspberries plants) and one *Pyrus*

Communis (pear tree) are asleep in their new fertilised holes in the extremely hard-to-dig Karst ground. A very elegant new Acacia dealbata (mimosa tree) oversees their rest from near the entrance of the property. As it swings, pushed by the Bora wind, I wonder how they will all look like in a few months, when the mimosa's yellow scent will propagate in the air.

Looking into December's mirror

Although the Solstice announces longer daylight time, we are effectively entering Winter, and it is short days and cold nights that we have to traverse. If like me you enjoy the comforting warmth of lit candles, or the hypnotic dance of flames in the fireplace, you might notice how thoughts, fantasies and dreams move more freely when our gaze follows Fire. As mine wanders in no particular

direction, I find it inspiring to look at December as it becomes a mirror for 2024. How many images appear!



What do you see in yours? What is December telling you about your year 2024? What major events have marked your life? How have you changed, and what has changed around you?

Should you wish to engage with these questions, Winter's time and space are great for this. I suggest you get yourself a hot chocolate and sip it very slowly, guided by the wonderful little girl above created by my illustrator friend <u>Hannah Sanguinetti</u>, in her 3D composition 'Hot Chocolate for the Hands, Head and Heart'.
